Task Force on an Inclusive and Welcoming Church

The newly created Task Force on an Inclusive and Welcoming Church met for the first time in November at the NGLS office. The group of clergy and lay people from throughout the synod are working together to provide resources that facilitate conversations about how we welcome and include lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ) people in our faith communities.

The Task Force is still formulating specific goals, but has drafted an initial purpose statement. "The purpose of the Task Force is to create or identify resources, including people, that will be made available to congregations, synodical bodies, or individuals who are engaged in conversations about being an inclusive and welcoming church, specifically to LGBTQ people. The consistent end goal of all these resources is to strengthen the unity of Christ's Church."
