Where should we begin? The first 11 chapters of Genesis are full of beginnings and beginnings again. There are two different creation stories, the flood narrative which resets everything a third time, and finally the tower of Babel which begins some more troubles. Join Pastor Tommy as the class looks at these well-travelled stories and we begin to separate the waters above from the waters below. The class will help participants see the stories with fresh eyes, as if from the beginning.

Materials: Participants will need a bible in their preferred translation. If interested, the instructor will be using Luther's Lectures on Genesis found in the first two volumes of Luther's Works and the new Anchor Bible Commentary by Ronald Hendel.
