Even in small communities, many of us feel caught in ideological silos, surrounded by political or religious echo chambers. As national rhetoric grows more divisive, the question becomes urgent: **How do we strengthen connections with our neighbors so our communities cultivate care rather than hostility?**

Keweenaw Faiths United—formed in 2019 after vandalism at the local Jewish temple—brings people across religions and denominations together to be peacemakers, build bridges, and take a stand against violence. Today, the group hosts quarterly luncheons where leaders engage in intentional conversation and collaborative action.

In this one-hour session, you'll hear how one community is bridging religious divides and have the chance to reflect on both the gifts and challenges of interfaith work.
