In response to the resolution passed at our most recent Synod Assembly, the Synod World Hunger Committee would like to encourage congregations to advocate for a strong and robust Farm Bill that is making its way through congress this summer. In the past, the Farm bill has been a bipartisan effort to see hat millions of children, veterans, disabled, and unemployed receive nutrition through the SNAP program (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program). Advocacy for policies like the Farm Bill provides a means to express the love for our neighbor that is at the core of our Christian identify by shaping policy that will contribute to the well-being of God's people and creation.

Next week, the Senate will review a proposed budget that will influence the U.S. government's treatment of immigrants in the U.S. and how the government addresses the root causes of migration.


Our faith calls us to welcome the stranger and seek the good of our neighbors. <u>Contact your Senators today to urge them to make budget decisions that protect children and keep families together!</u>

Senators will be making important decisions about how money is allocated for the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and the Department of State (DOS) for Fiscal Year 2019. Allocations for both agencies in the current fiscal year are concerning: DHS is receiving more funds to add hundreds of detention beds to imprison over 40,000 immigrants. In addition, DOS received funding to address the root causes of migration, which alarmingly also includes money for military training of forces known to have committed human rights violations.

The Senate has the opportunity next week to make changes and create a system that better respects the God-given dignity of all

people. As the past few weeks have shown, the actions of DHS and DOS have directly impacted the lives of children and families who escape conflict in their own countries and make their way to the U.S. Budgets are moral documents that reflect the values of a country. <u>Urge your Senators to make budget decisions</u> that stand for the safety and protection of the most vulnerable among us.

A Declaration of Our Inter-Religious Commitment:

This draft policy statement was developed by an interreligious task force appointed by Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton in 2016. The draft presents a common, theological basis and practical framework for this church's inter-religious relations, taking into consideration the church's varied ministry contexts, challenges and opportunities. Draft Social Statement on Women and Justice:

This timely draft addresses issues of sexism, many which have recently dominated the headliners. Some of the issues the draft explores include: how Lutherans understand scripture, restricted access to health care and economic resources, objectifying portrayals of women and girls in the media, gender based violence. 
