Flood Recovery Goes On!

Again, thank you to all who have helped in ANY way. This week we are beginning to move from the initial **response** phase to **recovery** phase.

The supply center for flood relief goods and tools (not furniture or clothing) is being relocated to the old J.C. Penney store in the Copper Country Mall (rear entrance). It will open Monday July 2. It is not shutting down over the weekend, but will be moving then.

The **Volunteer Resource Center** is also moving to the old J.C. Penney store (formerly the hair salon in the rear) from its current location at Evangel Baptist Church in Houghton.

The **Call Center** line for both needs flood victims have **and** volunteers will now go through Dial Help at the same number, 906-233-6621.

Help is needed **NOW** through the weekend to move the supplies to the new site. After that, people will be needed to staff and manage it. Please call the volunteer hotline at 906-233-6621 and let them know of your availability. If you have a special interest in managing the operation for weeks to come, your help would be greatly appreciated. If you do, please call Lieutenant Nick Roberts at the Houghton Police Department.

The hot meals and bag lunches through St. Ignatius have been **terminated**. Thank you to the folks at St. Ignatius and all the volunteers who helped them!

Here is what you can do for days and weeks to come:

WHAT WE **NEED**

Continual work on homes and sites coordinated through the Volunteer Resource Center, and staffing the Volunteer Resource Center.

Visquine, duct tape, smaller (12 oz) Gatorade or Powerade, fans, dehumidifiers.

Financial donations can be made through Keweenaw Community Foundation (906-482-9673), Portage Health Foundation (906-523-5920), Lutheran Social Services of Wisconsin and Upper Michigan / Lutheran Disaster Response (https://www.lsswis.org/Keweenaw) or any other organization that you may be aware of.

WHAT WE **DON'T** NEED

Bottled water, clothing, furniture, food, most tools.

LONG RANGE PLANS

When non-locals leave toward the end of the week, it will be (and has been and will continue to be!) **local people** who will need to do what we can to help individuals in need. We will need to organize and mobilize people through churches and community organizations. More on just how that will happen at a later date.

A **long range plan** is being set in place with city and county planners. It will facilitate the transition to assessment of each of the over 300 homes damaged, planning for necessary demolition and then to electrical and construction work on homes.

In response to the resolution passed at our most recent Synod Assembly, the Synod World Hunger Committee would like to encourage congregations to advocate for a strong and robust Farm Bill that is making its way through congress this summer. In the past, the Farm bill has been a bipartisan effort to see that millions of children, veterans, disabled, and unemployed receive nutrition through the SNAP program (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program). Advocacy for policies like the Farm Bill provides a means to express the love for our neighbor that is at the core of our Christian identify by shaping policy that will contribute to the well-being of God's people and creation.



Draft Social Statement on Women and Justice:

This timely draft addresses issues of sexism, many which have recently dominated the headliners.

Some of the issues the draft explores include: how Lutherans understand scripture, restricted access to health care and economic resources, objectifying portrayals of women and girls in the media, gender based violence. The comment period for this draft is


