Representatives from the Northern Great Lakes Synod gathered in Milwaukee, August 5-10 at the ELCA Churchwide Assembly under the theme "We Are Church," joining around 900 voting delegates from across the country. In his sermon during Monday's opening worship, Rev. William "Chris" Boerger, secretary of the ELCA, emphasized how the assembly theme is central to the assembly's purpose.

"We are church," said Boerger. "We gather here in Milwaukee with this theme. We are church. But we do not say, 'We are the church.' We know the church of Jesus Christ is much larger than the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. But we are part of it.

"We are the church because of what is happening here among us ... the gospel is being preached, the sacraments are the center of what's happening here this week. ... We are the church because of what God is doing."

Some Highlights of the Churchwide Assembly included...

• Re-election of Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton to a

- second 6-year term on the first ballot!
- Election of Deacon Sue Rothmeyer to serve as the new Secretary of the ELCA
- Approved a declaration of apology to our siblings of African descent, which was received by the African Descent Lutheran Association with thanks and a call for accountability and living into the words shared.
- Adopted a new social statement, "Faith, Sexism, and Justice: A Call to Action," and its implementing resolutions.

- Deacons (rostered ministers of word and service) will now be "ordained"—a change from the previous practice of "consecration."
- There were celebrations of the milestones of 50 years of women's ordination, 40 years since the first woman of color was ordained, and 10 years since full inclusion of LGBTQIA+ clergy.



Wisconsin Council of Churches will be taking one bus of faith leaders (seats 25) on a pilgrimage starting in Memphis, travel through Birmingham, Selma and Montgomery.

Participants will be responsible for getting themselves to the trip origin in Memphis, and home from the finish point in Memphis. Cost is \$495 per person (shared room)/\$695 per person (single room) covers most costs. Seats on the bus are first-come, first-serve.
