MISSION INVESTMENT FUND

A Financial Ministry of the ELCA

Is your congregation eligible for a Paycheck Protection Program loan?

Don't miss the opportunity for financial relief. Apply by March 22.

Another round of Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans is now available for small businesses and organizations, including congregations, to help protect staff members' pay and other operating expenses during the pandemic. Even if your congregation already received a loan, it may be eligible for a second draw if it can demonstrate a 25% reduction in recurring revenue during any quarter of 2020. Borrowers will be able to apply for loan forgiveness following the term of the loan. Review the criteria for first and second draws here.


The <u>Mission Investment Fund</u> is cooperating with our financial partner, the ELCA Federal Credit Union (FCU), to offer these loans to eligible congregations and ministries. The FCU can help your congregation navigate its first or second draw, even if you received your first PPP loan through a different lender. Domestic Hunger Grant Application Essentials

Applications for the 2021 cycle of ELCA World Hunger Domestic Hunger Grants will open soon! Here is a brief overview of the timeline. Please visit the <u>ELCA Domestic Hunger Grants website</u> for all of the details.

- Registration open: March 17, 2021 May 5, 2021
 - NOTE: Applicants must be registered in ELCA GrantMaker to access the application. Allow up to two weeks for registration approval. If you have not registered by May 20, you will not be able to start a new application. If you have already registered in ELCA GrantMaker, you do not need to register again. Starting April 1, 2020, you can log in directly at elca.fluxx.io using the Google Chrome browser to start your application.
- Application open: April 19, 2021 May 21, 2021
- Application review: June 2021 October 2021
- Awards announced: Details on the grant decision timeline will be provided at a later date.
- Visit https://www.elca.org/domestichungergrants for the Domestic Hunger Grant Application Essentials.
 - Awards will be for a three-year cycle, with a maximum award of \$10,000 per year, contingent upon fund availability and the completion of annual evaluations.
 - New applications are accepted annually. The application period typically opens in spring.

Leadership Coaching in our Synod

Assistant to the Bishop, Pastor Jim Duehring, is an ELCA trained coach through CoachNet. **He is available for free coaching sessions** for interested and motivated individuals within our synod. Whether you are a rostered leader or a lay leader in your congregation, you might benefit from coaching.

- Coaching is a posture of helping someone achieve a goal.
- Deep listening happens and a supportive relationship is developed.
- ELCA Coaching is an interactive process between three people: the leader, the coach, and the Holy Spirit.
- Coaching trusts the Holy Spirit will guide, enlighten, and empower the
 process of self-discovery, marshal the needed resources to accomplish
 what is desired, and empower the change to achieve the desired results.
- Coaching is about growth, change, and results.
- It believes that the answers to what a leader wants to do lie within the leader.
- The task of the coach is to draw those out by creating the opportunity for the "ah-ha" moments of discovery.

It is the hope of our Synod Vitality Team to build up a culture of coaching within our synod to help individuals and congregational systems grow in faith and vitality!

Fasting for Climate Justice Fast, Pray, Act (22 Days of Fasting)

Reverend Jonathon Barker (ELCA Grace Lutheran, Kenosha, WI) invites all people of faith and conscience to join hands with him, Justin Blake, and Joe Cardinali of Kenosha as they journey through 22 Days of Fasting for Climate Justice (Friday,

March 5-March 27). These acts of personal sacrifice and contemplative prayer are encouraged and supported by the ELCA Lutheran Office Public Policy Wisconsin (LOPPW) and the Wisconsin Faith Coalition for Climate Justice, a project of LOPPW. The goal of this prayerful fast is to focus public attention and badly needed action on the climate emergency's harm to lives, jobs, and health of Wisconsin citizens, and to our sacred, life-sustaining natural environment. The growing global climate emergencies have already cost Wisconsinites 100 billion dollars in the last 20 years. So there is compelling urgency to act now.

Pastor Jonathon asks that you consider joining this state-wide climate justice fast in any way that you are able: a daily meditative prayer, fasting and prayer for a single meal, or fasting for one or more of the 22 days. Your thoughts, your prayers, and your participation are gratefully welcomed. You choose the way. And, be on the lookout for updates on the fast, from its launching, all the way to its conclusion.
