Hunger/Poverty Ministries Grant Application

The Northern Great Lakes Synod has applied for and received ANOTHER Covid Relief Grant! This grant is targeted for ministries that address issues of hunger and poverty. For example, if your congregation supports a food pantry, clothes closet, backpack program, meal program, or offers rent assistance, your ministry is eligible for this financial support. Leadership Coaching in our Synod

Assistant to the Bishop, Pastor Jim Duehring, is an ELCA trained coach through CoachNet. **He is available for free coaching sessions** for interested and motivated individuals within our synod. Whether you are a rostered leader or a lay leader in your congregation, you might benefit from coaching.

- Coaching is a posture of helping someone achieve a goal.
- Deep listening happens and a supportive relationship is developed.
- ELCA Coaching is an interactive process between three people: the leader, the coach, and the Holy Spirit.
- Coaching trusts the Holy Spirit will guide, enlighten, and empower the
 process of self-discovery, marshal the needed resources to accomplish
 what is desired, and empower the change to achieve the desired results.
- Coaching is about growth, change, and results.
- It believes that the answers to what a leader wants to do lie within the leader.
- The task of the coach is to draw those out by creating the opportunity for the "ah-ha" moments of discovery.

It is the hope of our Synod Vitality Team to build up a culture of coaching within our synod to help individuals and congregational systems grow in faith and vitality!

Unique 2021 Flexible Spending Account (FSA) Opportunity

Portico is adopting provisions in recent COVID-relief legislation (American Rescue Plan Act) that allow members to reconsider their 2021 FSA elections and adjust, as appropriate, during this one-time opportunity. Sponsored members can elect to change or begin pretax contributions to an FSA – without experiencing a qualifying life event – during a special enrollment window between **April 12 – April 23**.

Example scenarios where this opportunity could provide added value:

- Members expecting higher medical expenses in 2021 than previously estimated can now consider contributing more to a health FSA, or starting a new health FSA for expenses incurred on or after May 1.
- Members who pay for daycare can take advantage of the increased dependent care FSA limit of \$10,500, versus the previous \$5,250.
- Members worried about contributing too much can consider reducing their future contributions, to avoid forfeiture of any 2021 FSA balance remaining at year-end. (Note: Members cannot reduce their FSA election

below the amount they've already contributed or claimed, whichever is greater.)

Interested members must contact the Portico Customer Care Center **prior to** the 5 p.m. (Central) deadline on Friday, April 23. The toll-free number is 800.352.2876. These elections will take effect May 1. Affected employers will be contacted by Portico via email, beginning April 26, regarding new payroll withholding details for members who made changes to (or added) an FSA.
