

Whether you are a rostered leader or a lay leader in your congregation, you might benefit from coaching.


Coaching is a posture of helping someone achieve a goal.

- Deep listening happens and a supportive relationship is developed.
- ELCA Coaching is an interactive process between three people: the leader, the coach, and the Holy Spirit.
- Coaching trusts the Holy Spirit will guide, enlighten, and empower the
 process of self-discovery, marshal the needed resources to accomplish
 what is desired, and empower the change to achieve the desired results.
- Coaching is about growth, change, and results.
- It believes that the answers to what a leader wants to do lie within the leader.
- The task of the coach is to draw those out by creating the opportunity for the "ah-ha" moments of discovery.

It is the hope of our Synod Vitality Team to build up a culture of coaching within our synod to help individuals and congregational systems grow in faith and vitality!



Care-Filled Worship and Sacramental Life in a Lingering Pandemic

Since the early days of the pandemic, the ELCA has been a partner in the Ecumenical Consultation on Protocols for Worship, Fellowship, and Sacraments, publishing general and seasonal guidance for safe worship practices. Over the past two months, the consultation met once again to approve a comprehensive update to the guidance originally published in the summer of 2020, incorporating the latest CDC guidance and other interim guidance previously issued by the consultation. The consultation included an ecumenical group of theologians, scientists, physicians, pastors, bishops, and practitioners from at least seven church bodies. The Care-Filled Worship and Sacramental Life in a Lingering Pandemic document can be viewed here. Additional resources can be found on the ecumenical consultation website or Facebook page.

On **Wednesday**, **June 16 at 7:30 pm ET**, the consultation will host a webinar titled "Leading the Church in a Lingering Pandemic," a roundtable discussion with public health experts and pastors in a time of progress and uncertainty

concerning the Covid-19 pandemic. How will congregations minister to those who are vaccinated and those who are not vaccinated in multigenerational settings?
