Leadership Coaching in our Synod

Assistant to the Bishop, Pastor Jim Duehring, is an ELCA trained coach through CoachNet. **He is available for free coaching sessions** for interested and motivated individuals within our synod. Whether you are a rostered leader or a lay leader in your congregation, you might benefit from coaching.

- Coaching is a posture of helping someone achieve a goal.
- Deep listening happens and a supportive relationship is developed.
- ELCA Coaching is an interactive process between three people: the leader, the coach, and the Holy Spirit.
- Coaching trusts the Holy Spirit will guide, enlighten, and empower the
 process of self-discovery, marshal the needed resources to accomplish
 what is desired, and empower the change to achieve the desired results.
- Coaching is about growth, change, and results.
- It believes that the answers to what a leader wants to do lie within the leader.
- The task of the coach is to draw those out by creating the opportunity for the "ah-ha" moments of discovery.

It is the hope of our Synod Vitality Team to build up a culture of coaching within our synod to help individuals and congregational systems grow in faith and vitality!

Water Walk

July 21 in L'Anse, MI

The Walk begins at 7 am at First Sand Beach on Pequaming Road in L'Anse Township. The site is only a few hundred yards past KBIC Natural Resources Dept., (14359 Pequaming Rd., L'Anse, MI). The walk is 17 miles. There are passenger vehicles that follow along to provide reprieve as needed. Bring a light backpack with a sack lunch, snacks and water. Typically, the KBIC van comes along with extra water and food. In addition, you can leave your backpack with the van if you'd prefer not to carry it. We take our time. People walk at their own pace. It is a time of prayer and offering tobacco to the water whenever individuals are led to do so. Women wear long skirts.
