

Tolling of the Funeral Bell

At this time last year, just over 200,000 people had died of COVID-19 and we rang our church bells to honor their memory. This year, that number is climbing above 700,000 (as per CDC and WHO). Each death represents a grieving family, a loss suffered, the absence of a loved one felt.

Sunday, November 7 is All Saints Day. This is a day that our Church remembers our beloved dead. Again on this day, we will also remember the many who have died during this pandemic. Please include all those who grieve in your prayers during worship and your personal devotions. You are also invited to ring your church funeral bell for **five minutes at 12 noon CT/1 pm ET on Sunday, November 7**. Our Roman Catholic, Episcopal, and Methodist siblings, in addition to all community churches, are also invited to remember the dead in this way. World Hunger Quilt on Display

The 2018 Synod World Hunger quilt is on display in the atrium of the Marquette Medical Center (near Starbucks) for the month of October. Our theme that year was, "All in for World Hunger," and the quilt represents the work of all 82 congregations in the synod at the time. The design was created by Jackie Lehto, a professional quilter and member of Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Florence, Wisconsin. The back of each of the pieces tells which congregation contributed that square.
