Grant Opportunity for Michigan Congregations

The Climate Witness Project of World Renew and the Christian Reformed Church has launched a project called the Sacred Spaces Clean Energy Grant that enables low-income congregations of all faiths in Michigan to become energy efficient and to acquire solar energy. The project will make grants of \$100,000 for energy efficiency to ten low-income congregations and arrange for them to access solar energy.

Keweenaw Bay Indian Community Water Walk & Powwow

The water walk begins with ceremony at **7 am ET Wednesday**, **July 20** at First Sand Beach in Pequaming (directions can be found here). The 17-mile walk continues around the Bay to Sand Point in Baraga. All ages, genders, and ethnicities are welcome to walk for the water with KBIC. You are not required to walk the entire 17 miles. Vehicles will accompany walkers for reprieve.

The Powwow takes place **July 22-24** at the Ojibwa Campground about a mile and a half from the main blinker light in Baraga on Hwy 41 heading north. It is advised to bring your own chair as bleacher seats are limited. Vendors are available for food, drink and Native American arts and crafts. Pastor Julie Belew recommends attending the Grand Entries. The most popular are Friday or Saturday evenings at 7 pm ET.
