WHAT'S A CONGREGATION'S COMMITMENT?

- A congregation sends a "Guiding Team" of 4 to 7 lay people to 3 training sessions. The pastor also attends the trainings.
- The Training Sessions will take place at <u>Fortune Lake Lutheran Camp</u> on 3 Saturdays from 9am to 3pm (Central Time)
- Cost for Training Sessions is \$300* per congregation which includes meals and a copy of Dwight Zscheile's book, <u>The</u> <u>Agile Church</u>. (Dr. Zscheile is keynote speaker at the May 2019 Synod Assembly)

*The actual full costs of these trainings are supported by a generous subsidy from the Northern Great Lakes Synod and a Siebert Grant.

- June 29 "Tracing God's Movement in our Lives and Neighborhoods"
- September 7 "Learning by Doing: Using Action Learning to Discover God's Leading"

November 9 "Sharing our Learning: Intentional Reflections on Our Actions"

Coaching

Ongoing, monthly coaching will be provided to each congregation's lay "Guiding Team". Separate monthly coaching provided to pastors.

Coaches' Training

Interested rostered leaders or lay people who want to be a coach for this Faithful Innovations process will be trained by a professional coach.
