'JMBER 7
...MENDING
THE SYNOD
CONSTITUTION

Bishop Finegan introduced Resolution Number 7. This resolution comes to the Assembly from Zion, Manistique and the Synod Council. Rev. Doug Johnson read the resolved portion of the Resolution.

<u>RESOLVED</u>, that the constitution of the Northern Great Lakes Synod be amended as follows to redefine the geographical boundaries of Delta Conference (Conference 6) and Three Lakes Conference (Conference 7) (proposed changes are highlighted in grey with additions noted by <u>underline</u> and deletions noted by <u>strikethrough</u>):

S12.01.11. The names and boundaries of the conferences shall be:

Iron-Gogebic-Ontonagon Conference (Conference 1): The county of Gogebic and the southern half of Ontonagon County in the state of Michigan; the county of Iron in the state of Wisconsin.

Copper Country Conference (Conference 2): The counties of Baraga, Houghton, Keweenaw, and the northern half of Ontonagon County in the state of Michigan.

Headwaters Conference (Conference 3): The counties of Forest, Oneida, and Vilas, in the state of Wisconsin.

Four Rivers Conference (Conference 4): The counties of Dickinson and Iron in the state of Michigan; the county of Florence, and that portion of the county of Marinette north of a line running west to east along County Highways C, V, and K in the state of Wisconsin.

Menominee Valley Conference (Conference 5): The county of Menominee in the state of Michigan; that portion of the county of Marinette south of a line running west to east along County Highways C, V, and K in the state of Wisconsin.

Delta Conference (Conference 6): That portion of the county of Delta west of County Highway H13 The counties of Delta and Schoolcraft in the state of Michigan and Mathias Township in the County of Alger in the state of Michigan.

Three Lakes Conference (Conference 7): That portion of the county of Delta east of County Highway H13, Burt Township in Alger County, and the counties of Chippewa, Luce and Mackinac, and Schoolcraft in the state of Michigan.

Superior Central Conference (Conference 8): The county of Marquette and all of Alger County excluding Burt Township and Mathias Township in the state of Michigan.

It was moved and seconded by the Synod Council to adopt Resolution Number 7.

<u>BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED</u>, that the Northern Great Lakes Synod World Hunger Committee assist congregations of the Synod in carrying out this ministry.

<sup>1</sup>SNAP = the federal government program Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program which was formerly known as Food Stamps.
