MEET PASTOR JAMES DUEHRING, **OUR NEW SYNOD MISSIONER:** COORDINATOR FOR SYNODICALLY **AUTHORIZED MINISTERS-LICENSED** LAY MINISTERS

Pastor Jim Duehring has agreed to serve in a very part-time synod capacity as liaison with our Licensed Lay Ministers and the congregations they serve.

He continues his work as pastor at Prince of Peace in Harvey where he has served since 2008.

As Synod Missioner for these LLM's Pastor Jim will be visiting with each Licensed Lay Minister at their site of ministry at least

twice a year. He will facilitate evaluations of all Licensed Lay Ministers annually and submit recommendations to the Bishop for the re-appointment of LLM. He will also attend twice yearly meeting of Licensed Lay Ministry Advisory Committee.

Pastor Jim also will recommend persons for possible LLM positions and advise the bishop on possible policy changes.

CLERGY-WHAT AN **OPPORTUNITY!** "FAMILY SYSTEMS" WORK IN OUR **SYNOD** 2013-2014

Dr. Doug Hester was in our synod last fall doing

introductory workshops for clergy and lay leaders on Family Systems Theory. Dr. Hester is a recognized leader and teacher of this movement that helps the church see itself more clearly. He has offered to spend some time in our synod in the next year to do some in depth work with our clergy and with clergy from other religious communities.

Your Synod Leadership Support Committee is enthusiastic about bringing Doug here to spend some time working with our pastoral leaders. The plan is to have three two day sessions (about 36 contact hours) in a group of at least 15 participants. The sessions would be all day Monday and all day Tuesday. Three weeks have been selected in this coming fall, winter and in the spring of 2014. The group would meet at Fortune Lake Camp October 7-8; Feb 24-25 and May 19-20. All sessions are from 9:00 am CT- 4:00 p.m. CT.

We seldom have the opportunity to have this significant continuing education opportunity in our synod. Usually we need to drive to Minneapolis or to Chicago for such a program. It will be a great opportunity to have it within reasonable driving distance.

The anticipated cost for the total event (6 days) will be

\$750. The synod will <u>reimburse ELCA clergy \$200</u> of that cost, leaving the pastor or the congregation responsible for \$550 plus housing and meals. Flexible payment plans can be arranged.

I need to know if this is of interest to you! Could you respond to this email soon and let us know if you would like to continue the conversation about this possibility. Seven pastors have already indicated their interest! I recommend this work to you.
