Prayers for Peace Requested

Members of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) are called to pray for the people of Syria, the Middle East and throughout the world. The prayer is for the protection of people "affected by the fighting in Syria" and for "all who are working for peace: international leaders, politicians, religious leaders and ordinary citizens" and that "all of us be strengthened by the hope of a future built on love and justice for all. In the midst of the complexities, volatility, uncertainties and tragedies in Syria and the surrounding region, let us join together in praying for peace," said the Rev. Mark S. Hanson, ELCA presiding bishop. "We can have deep differences about the responsible way forward," said Hanson. "Our religious convictions may be different. The public debate is intense and so much is at stake. What better time to pray? God has entrusted us with just one creation. We are all created in God's image for relationships that reflect God's desire for harmony, dignity and peace with justice. Let our prayers be cries of lament. Let us listen for God's word of promise. Let the diverse languages and petitions of our prayers reflect the beauty of diversity in the midst of our one God given humanity. Yes, may we humbly confess our sinfulness and gratefully receive God's gift of mercy and strength to be about God's work of peace and reconciliation."

Bishop Hanson sent letters to the U.S. president and Congress urging for more diplomatic efforts over pursuing military action in response to reports of the use of chemical weapons against the people of Syria. ELCA members and congregations are invited by the Bishop to write to Congress and to the president to "vote against an authorization to take military action against Syria" and to ask the president "not to take such action." ELCA members are also committed to keeping decision-makers in prayer, asking that "God will continue to give them wisdom as they discern the best path to avoid atrocities while pursuing peace."

Finance for Congregations

Resources for congregational treasurers & bookkeepers

(Available on the ELCA website--see Office of the Treasurer)

Complying with tax requirements and tax reporting is the responsibility of each ELCA congregation's treasurer. In addition, it is their responsibility to be aware of tax laws and reporting requirements as they are established and change.

The ELCA Office of the Treasurer strongly encourages congregational treasurers to consult up-to-date resource materials on tax requirements and reporting. Treasurers are also encouraged to consult with a qualified tax preparer and/or attorney familiar with tax laws, as necessary.

Congregational Treasurers Financial & Accounting Guide This guide for treasurers and bookkeepers reviews the responsibilities of the treasurer, creating the chart of accounts, financial reporting and more.

Handling Financial Matters in the Congregation This document is an overview of many of the financial matters relating to the congregation. Some areas mentioned in this document are separation of financial duties, safeguarding offerings, charitable deductions, and designated and restricted gifts.

Accounting Methods — Cash Basis and Accrual Basis How does a congregation decide on a way to record transactions? Learn more about the advantages and disadvantages of cash vs. accrual methods of accounting.

Program Budget Presentations Wondering how to best show your congregation's budget in a way that will describe the breadth and depth of the congregation? This article provides a model for how a congregation can combine the dollar and cents budget and their strategic directions in what is often called a 'Program Budget' to reflect the various programmatic areas of the congregation's mission and ministries.

Financial Contingency Planning This document addresses key components of financial contingency planning for congregations, including operating reserves, cash flow projections, budget reductions and banking considerations.

Accountable Reimbursement Policies For business and tax reasons, in most instances, it is in the best interests of the congregation and its staff to have in place an accountable reimbursement policy to pay for the business expenses that are necessary to do the ministry of the congregation.

Who can perform a congregational audit?

How does the audit process begin?

What should be done with payroll and tax records?

What is involved in auditing cash?

How is the control system audited?

We as entities that collect, store, and communicate information have a responsibility to those that provide us their information/data to keep it safe and secure. This helpful set of simply slides provide an explanation of PII (Personal Identity Information) and how to keep data secure at many levels.

Identity Theft Every day, the risk of identity theft grows greater. Congregations -- and congregation administrators -- are not immune from the risk of identity theft nor from the concern members may have for protecting their personal data. Government agencies and private organizations have enacted new laws, regulations and policies intended to prevent the loss of identity information.
